- ♦ **Parking**: No Parking signs have been installed for the ingress and egress roads of the townhomes. This has been done for the safety of our community ensuring that emergency responders will have easy access to the rear of the townhomes. Violators will be towed to Green's Garage at the OWNERS expense.
- ♦ Trash / Yard Waste: Please dispose of all trash properly. Trash pick-up is on Fridays, so please do not put your trash cans out until Thursday evening and retrieve your cans as soon as possible on Friday. Yard waste is to be placed at the curb Sunday evening for Monday pick-up. "Kraft" style paper bags ONLY.
- ♦ **Common Grounds**: There is NO dumping of yard waste, dirt, sod, construction material etc. on HOA common grounds. If you are having a company do work for you make sure they are aware of this as well. These items must be hauled away and disposed of properly and NOT on HOA property.
- ♦ Weed Spraying: The HOA will be spraying for weeds in the parking areas behind the town homes in the upcoming weeks. This is being done to make sure the weeds do not shorten the life the blacktop. An exact date has not been decided but the date will be posted on the entrance signs to our community. Please keep a lookout for the date.

WATER RESTRICTIONS IN HAMPSTEAD

Effective April 1, 2008, the Town of Hampstead has instituted a water ban.

Water provided by the Town of Hampstead to its water customers may not be used to:

- 1. Water or irrigate lawns, gardens, trees, shrubbery or other vegetation except by using a hand-held datainer has with a spring-loaded/automatic shutoff where such hose is continuously attended.
- 2. Wash automobiles, trucks, trailers, boats, motor bikes, campers or other vehicles except with a hose spring-loaded/automatic shutoff and where such hose is continuously attended.
- 3. Fill decorative ponds or fountains.
- 4. Fill swimming pools, hot tubs, wading pools or other similar structures.

Offenders will receive a verbal or written warning. A second offense will result in a \$25 fine, a third offense will result in a \$100 fine, a fourth offense will result in a \$250 fine and a fifth offense will result in termination of service. Non-payment of fines will also result in termination of service.
